Their degrowth prescription for wealthy countries is excellent, but here is what I submit is lacking:

1) They say "**Reduce less-necessary production.** This means scaling down destructive sectors such as fossil fuels, mass-produced meat and dairy, fast fashion, advertising, cars and aviation, including private jets."

Military expenditures/imperialism and its ongoing wars, the most destructive sector, are not mentioned as the major obstacle blocking chances to achieve the 1.5 deg C warming target.

Fossil fuels must be terminated, not simply reduced, and very soon, in no more than 20 years from now.
